You wake each morning surrounded by friends.

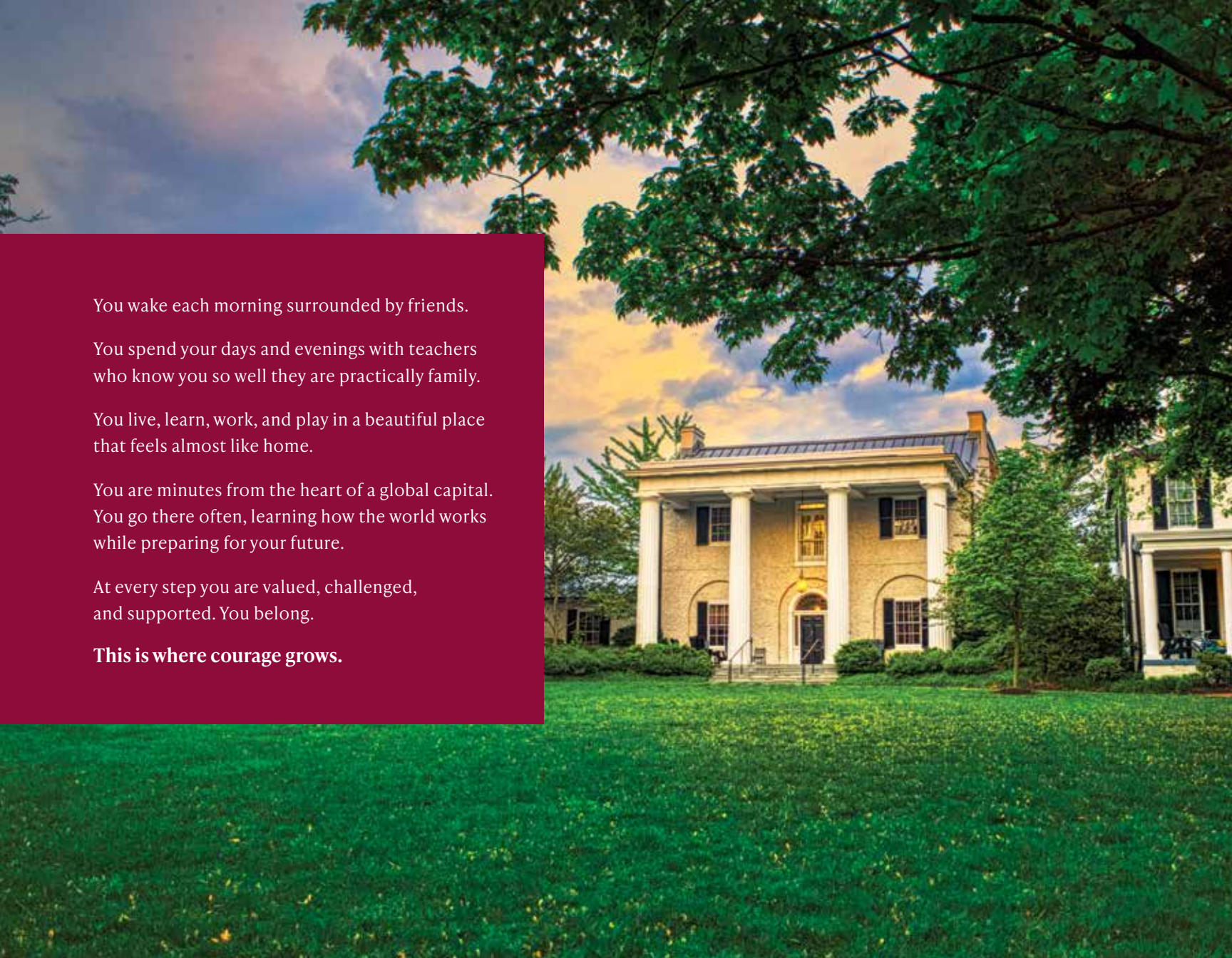
You spend your days and evenings with teachers who know you so well they are practically family.

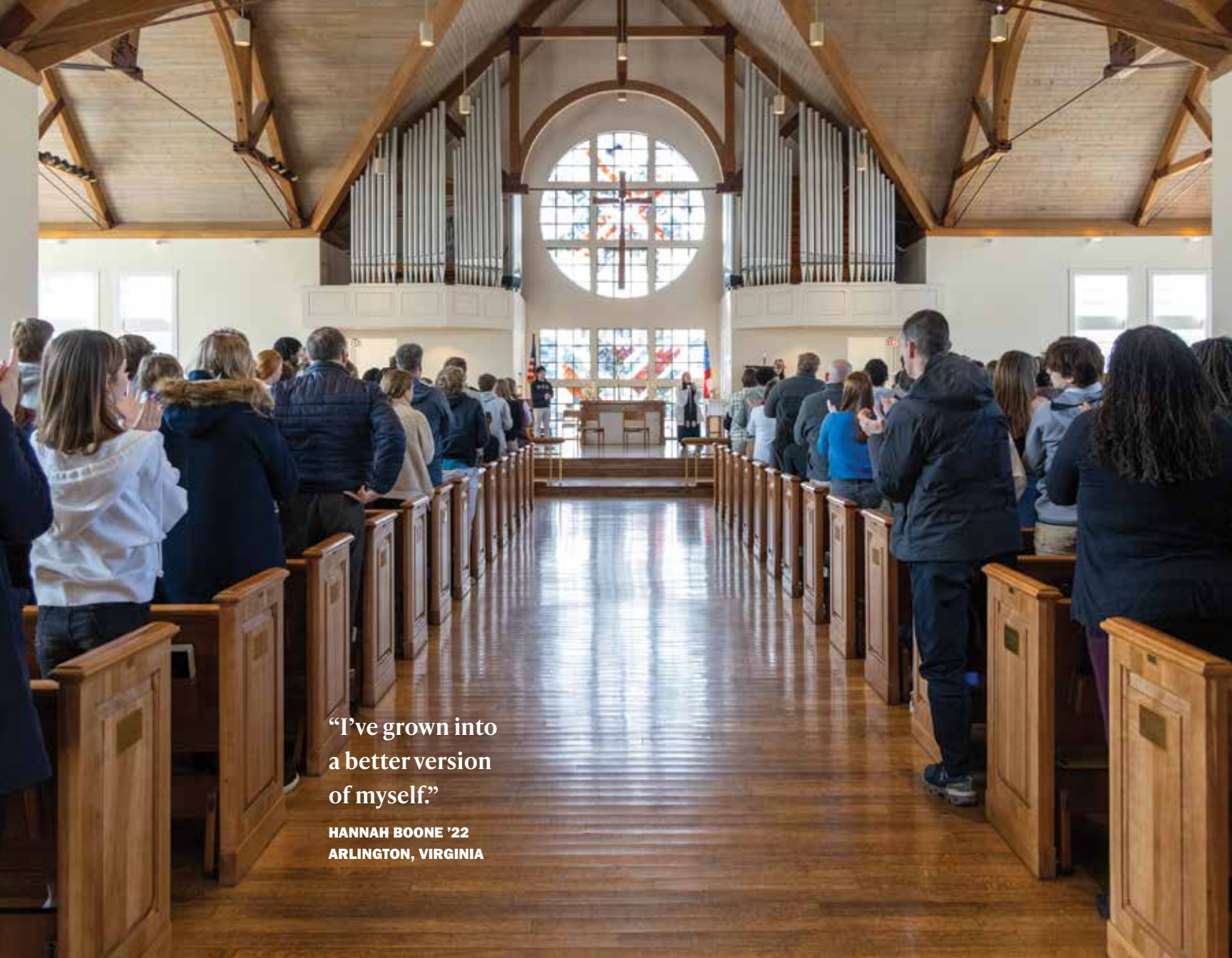
