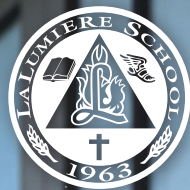

Academics

The core of our mission is to nurture and develop the whole person in an academically challenging environment that promotes active engagement and personal responsibility.

With an average class size of ten, our traditional college preparatory liberal arts curriculum provides a foundation in English literature and composition, mathematics, social and physical sciences, with a special emphasis on critical thinking and the mastery of oral and written communication. Students will also study physical and life sciences, world languages, theology, ethics, and the creative arts. With a hybrid block schedule, our students will experience both 45-minute and 80-minute classes throughout their week at school. It is a great way to prepare for the longer classes they will experience in college. Our academic program provides La Lumiere graduates with a distinct advantage over most of their peers: they are trained to think critically, articulate clearly, work collaboratively, and take action confidently, with a solid awareness of morals and values.

Student Life

Student life at La Lumiere School is centered around community, connection, and personal growth.

With a small, close-knit community, students attend class, are involved in activities, and quickly build meaningful relationships with students from every continent, except Antarctica. Traditions such as Orientation, Heads' Cup competitions, Freshman Experience, Family Weekend, Taste of La Lumiere, and student-led events create a vibrant and welcoming atmosphere where students feel known and involved. Leadership opportunities through the Prefect Program encourage students to take ownership of campus life, while service initiatives, residential life programming, and community gatherings help students grow in independence, confidence, and character. Whether students are living in the dorms or commuting each day, La Lumiere offers an environment where students are encouraged to explore their interests, form lasting friendships, and become more complete versions of themselves.

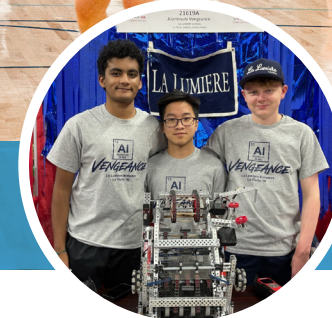

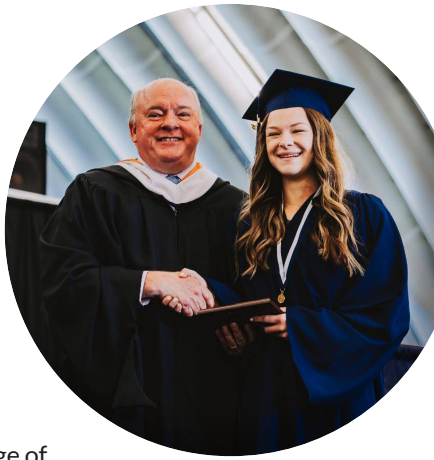

College Counseling

The College Counseling Office at La Lumiere partners with students and families to identify colleges and universities where each student will thrive academically, personally, and socially.

We believe there is no single definition of success in the college search process. Our graduates enroll at a wide range of institutions, from highly selective colleges and universities to large public research institutions and everything in between. The four-year college counseling process starts day one, when freshman families start learning about college in group conversations. Students participate in the college counseling seminar their junior year to prepare for application submission the fall of their senior year.
